Together a fome

Here are some activities you could do together as a family. Begin with the story and then do as many or as few as you like, in any order.


Bible Passage

Today we will be exploring together, Jesus' Parable of the Sower

You can find the story in your Bible in:

Matthew 13:1-9

Read the story together – choose a Bible translation or children's story version which best suits your family.



A prayer to say together

Dear God,

Thank you for all the things we learn about you and about how to follow Jesus through your Word.

Help us to listen and learn so that good things--like love and joy and goodness and faithfulness--might grow in us, and help us to share these things with the world.

We pray for those who don't know you and are worried about having the things they need. Give them faith and a relationship with you.

Amen

Discussion

A question for adults to ask children What different kinds of ground did the seed land on?

Some of the seed landed on a path. Other seeds landed on rocky ground, thorny ground, and good ground.

A question for everyone to discuss
What lesson do you think Jesus was trying to teach?

Though Jesus explains a meaning for this parable later in the chapter (Matthew 13: 18-23), this is not the case with all of his parables. In fact, parables can often mean different things at different times to different people. The fact that Jesus concludes this parable by saying "whoever has ears let him hear" encourages to think for ourselves first. Encourage your child to ponder what s/he thinks the parable means. Children are often more able than adults to produce possible messages because they are more likely to approach scripture with a sense of open wonder.

Family Activity

Items needed: Container for plant, soil, fruit/vegetable seeds

Collect the seeds from any fruits/vegetables you have in the house (tomatoes, peppers, apples, oranges, etc.)

You might need to be creative in getting soil from your garden. If you have multiple seeds from the same fruit or

vegetable and multiple containers, you could try planting the seeds in different soils and see how it affects their growth.

Plant the seeds in the container and place in a sunny windowsill or outside in a protected area where it receives sunlight. Make sure to water regularly.





A verse to remember

Psalm 119 v 11

I have taken your words to heart so I would not sin against you.

Studies show that we must read, hear, or do something six times before it is in our head--so to take the Bible to heart, we need to read and study the Bible in such a way that we know it's story "by heart."

To learn this verse together, you could come up with some actions to help you remember it or decorate the verse on a piece of paper and put it up somewhere to remind you of it through the week.



The parable Jesus told was a good story, but it wasn't *just* a good story. Jesus' parables always had deeper meanings. One thing we can learn from the parable of the sower is that Jesus wants us to stick to God's Word and to grow.

When we choose to listen to God's Word and try to understand it and follow it, we're like good soil. As we grow stronger in our faith and in our ability and desire to


follow Jesus, God's Word can produce good things in us--like love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, and self-control. We call these the fruit of the


