

Sunday 23rd August Twelfth Sunday after Pentecost

Here are some activities you could do together as a family. Begin with the story and then do as many or as few as you like, in any order.

Discussion

Some questions for adults to ask children:

What is the first question Jesus asked his disciples? (v.13) What is the second? (v.15) What is the difference between those two questions? What did Peter say? (v.16) How did Jesus respond to Peter's statement? (v. 17-19)

Jesus asked his disciples who people said he was. Then he asked "who do *you* believe I am. This is important because the disciples had been following Jesus and observing him and learning from him in a way that others had not. From these constant personal interactions, Peter recognized that Jesus was the the Christ (Messiah)--God's chosen, anointed One sent to save his people. Jesus said that Peter was correct!

A question for children to ask adults:

Who is Jesus to you?

Family Activity 1

Gather everyone together and play a game of "Who Am I" by using the following clues to figure out who or what "it" is. Then have each person make up their own "Who Am I?" clues for someone (or some thing) else!

- 5. I was born in Bethlehem and placed in a manger. I healed sick people. I taught people about God's love. I love everyone in the whole world. Who Am I?


Bible Passage

A prayer to say together


Dear God,

In the name of Jesus the Christ we pray, Amen.




A verse to remember


Psalm 124 v 8 Our help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.

Where does our help come from? Psalm 124 reminds us that our help comes from God, who loves the world so much that He came to be among us in Jesus, the Christ. So, when life seems hard, "look up": Look up from your phone, your computer or television, and your work, look up from your fears, your wants, and your way of doing things. Look up and see our God--who made heaven and earth--for it is in God that we find our help.

To learn this verse together, you could come up with some actions to help you remember it or decorate the verse on a piece of paper and put it up somewhere to remind you of it through the week.
