# A prayer to say together

### Discussion

### A question for adults to ask children

How do you think Joseph felt when the angel told him in his dream that Mary was going to have such a special baby?

How did Joseph respond?

Though our Bible doesn't tell us how Joseph felt about what the angel in his dream told him, we can imagine the news might have seemed very strange, or maybe even a little scary. How would you feel if an angel appeared to you in a dream and told you to do something?!

What we do know, however, is that Joseph believed the angel. For he responded by taking Mary as his wife, just as he was told to do.

# A verse to remember

### 2 Samuel 7 v 16

But your family and your kingdom will continue always before me.

Your throne will last forever.

These words were spoken to King David through the prophet Nathan - compare them with the words of the Angel Gabriel in Luke 1:32-33 Jesus' birth had been part of God's plan for a very long time, the Old Testament is full of prophecies that Jesus fulfilled. Joseph was a direct descendant of King David!

To learn this verse together, you could come up with some actions to help you remember it or decorate a copy and put it up somewhere you can see it during the week.

# **Active Advent**

God is amazing and there will always be more of God for us to experience and come to know. Why not take on these challenges during the fourth week of Advent, you could do one each day or do them all at once, they are all about discovering more about God.

### Dec 20th

Set a timer for 1 minute, how many different names and words can you think of to describe God?

### Dec 21st

Read 1 Corinthians 12 v7-11, it talks about the different gifts God has for us. Ask God which gift He would like to give you today through the Holy Spirit.

### Dec 22nd

Stretch out as wide as you can, now stretch up as high as you can. Read Ephesians 3:18-19 and see what is says about how BIG God's love is for you.

### Dec 23rd

Jesus died on a cross so that our sins could be forgiven and we could be saved. God's forgiveness is for everybody. Take some time today to pray for a friend of family member who doesn't yet know God as their friend and Savior.

### Dec 24th

We are precious children of God. Spend some time listening to God today. Ask God to tell you some of the things He loves about you!

### Dec 25th

**Merry Christmas!** As you celebrate together don't forget to stop and sing Happy Birthday to Jesus – the reason for the season!

# Family Activity 1

Joseph was obedient--he did what the angel told him to do. Play a game of Simon says together, taking turns being the leader. You might like to talk together about what it means to be obedient and to commit ourselves to serving God.

Use the template on the next page to make your own printable angel decorations. You could hang them on your tree or around the house as a reminder of this part of the story.




# Family Activity 3


What does your name mean?
