### Discussion

Family Activity 1

Here are some ideas of ways you can bless others:

- Look through your wardrobes for something you could donate that you have outgrown or no longer wear.

#### A verse to remember

1 Corinthians 1:2b

You were called to be God's holy people - saints - with all people everywhere who call upon and trust in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours.

We sometimes think of saints as people who have a special holiness--who live perfectly and never make mistakes. But the Bible teaches us that anyone and everyone who calls upon Jesus and trusts (believes and follows) Him can be called saints.

# Active Prayer

As we try to follow God's way and live Jesus' teachings, we need to take time and be apart to think and pray about such teachings.

One way to do this is to walk the path of a labyrinth to meditate and pray. Labyrinths are usually found outdoors, but some people like to use a finger labyrinth.

Using the labyrinth on the next page, begin at the opening near the bottom and move your finger along the path tracing into the middle of the labyrinth and then back out to where you began.

As you follow the path, think about the saints in your life, and ask God to show you ways that you can be a saint of God by following Jesus, too.



# Family Activity 2

#### **Create a Blessings and Beauty Collage**

You will need: paper, old magazines, other craft materials (markers, crayons, etc.), scissors, glue/glue-stick or tape

Using paper, decorations, and old magazines, find or create pictures of things that make you unique and beautiful in God's eyes. Try to stay away from typical ads and images of "perfection" as the world sees, and instead chose things that remind you of what you can do for God and how you want to be remembered as a follower of Christ.
