Here are some activities you could do together as a family. Begin with the story and then do as many or as few as you like, in any order.

# Bible Passage

Today we will be exploring together the story of the Angel visiting Mary.

You can find it in your Bible in: Luke 1 v 26–38

Read the story together – choose a Bible translation or children's story version which best suits your group.



# A prayer to say together

Dear God,

Thank you for the story of Mary who you chose to be the mother of your son Jesus. Help us to learn from her example, to be obedient and servant hearted as we live for you.

Help us to be brave as we face scary and uncertain times, trusting in you to protect and guide us. Help us to praise and worship you in the middle of the challenges we face.

This Christmas may we listen to your voice and seek for ways to serve you in our families and communities, offering our lives to you in obedience just as Mary did.

Amen.

## Discussion

### A question for adults to ask children

How do you think Mary felt when the angel told her that she was going to have such a special baby?

Do you think Mary was a good choice?

Verse 29 tells us that even before Gabriel had told her about the baby, she was surprised by his greeting. Mary never expected to be chosen for a special task by God. Perhaps this is what made her such a good choice.

It must have been scary to be visited by an angel and to be given such a big important mission but Mary trusted in God and was obedient, saying "let this happen to me as you say." These words are very similar to the ones that Jesus spoke in the garden of Gethsemane before going to the cross. Perhaps God chose Mary because he knew that she would raise her son to be obedient and servant-hearted like she was.

A question for children to ask adults

What is the best thing about being a parent?

# Family Activity 1

Mary was obedient saying "I am the servant of the Lord. Let this happen to me as you say!" Play a game of Simon says together and take turns being the leader. You might also like to talk together about what it means to be obedient and to commit ourselves to serving God.



# A verse to remember



### Luke 1:38

# "I am the Lord's servant. May it happen to me as you have said."

Mary was a poor girl living in a rural village in an occupied country. Everyone around her discounted her. But God did not. God valued Mary and had work and a plan for her. God values us and has work and a plan for each of us, too. Like Mary, may we be ready and willing to do our part.

To learn this verse together, you could come up with some actions to help you remember it or decorate a copy and put it up somewhere you can see it during the week.

# **Active Advent**

Just like Mary we are invited to offer our lives to God in worship and service. God has a role and mission for each one of us. Why not take on these worship and service challenges during the second week of Advent? You could do one each day or do them all at once.

### Dec 6th

Draw a picture of yourself in your dream job, what area of work would you like to serve God in?



### Dec 7th

Add to the picture to show you using a skill or talent that God has given you. How could you use that skill to serve and worship God today?



### Dec 8th

Draw a heart on your picture, pray and ask God to help you be servant hearted, happy and willing to love and serve others.




### Dec 9th

### Dec 12th


Ask God if there are any areas in your life where you could serve Him better or be more obedient.
