Dear friends,

We hope you are doing well this new year and staying healthy! Leena is grateful for your prayers and support, and asks for prayer for three important ministry changes.

Please pray for the children of Markapur: Leena has had to close the ministry in Markapur. ServeTrust was providing the children daily transportation to school and monthly support. After lockdown lifted, children did not return to school. Older children are working with their parent's approval. Please pray that these children will resume their education.

<u>Please pray for the new School of Joy Vinukonda</u>: The budget for Markapur is now being used to support a new school in the village of Vinukonda, about an hour from ServeTrust. When Leena discovered that the children of this village had no nearby school, she started one! Please pray for these 31 children, their families, and the new teacher.

Please pray for the families in the Hindu Temple Village: In April, the government is moving these families to another plot of land 3-4 km away from their current site. These families are very distressed as this land has no nearby school and no electric or water supply. This is the village that was so close to Leena's mother's heart, and the one that you graciously supported through the Viveka Memorial Fund. Leena had hoped to provide toilets for the village, but now will use the funds to help the families rebuild thatched huts for their homes. Leena is so grateful for these funds which will meet an unanticipated need. These are extremely poor people who earn the money they need for food by doing day labor in the fields or collecting plastic and metal trash to sell. Please pray that God will help them rebuild their lives. Please pray for Leena as she comforts and ministers to them as they grieve.

Once again, we are so grateful for your care and support of Leena and the people she serves.

This is the last Illuminator before our joyous celebration of the resurrection and so I wanted to be sure to write a little bit about the special services we have coming up.

The first is Palm Sunday—this Sunday—at 11:00 AM in the sanctuary. You are invited to join us in worship as we celebrate and commemorate the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. We will celebrate Christ's arrival as the arrival of a different kind of king, one who will bring true peace to his people.

Our second special service will be on Wednesday, April 13th at 6:30 PM in our sanctuary. This will be our hand-washing service where we will seek to imitate our Savior by washing each other's hands as an act of love and service. We will make sure to perform the hand-washing in a Covid-conscious manner that is safe for all involved.

Our third special service will be on Good Friday, April 15th at 7:00 in our sanctuary. At this service we will read through and ponder the crucifixion, death, and burial of Jesus. It is a more somber service as the Christ light will be extinguished, the altar will be stripped of all decoration, and the service itself will end in silence and darkness. 
Dear Rev. Herring,

On her website, *Worshipping with Children*, minister Carolyn Brown laments that "all too often many children go straight from the Palm Sunday parade to the Easter alleluias and totally miss what happens in between."

With Holy Week (April 10-April 17) fast approaching, I wanted to remind you that though childcare will be provided during all of our Holy Week services, there are several good reasons to bring your children—especially those who are elementary school-aged—with you to all of these special services (not just those on Sunday!).

First, when children attend the weeknight worship services such as Good Friday along with Palm Sunday and Easter, *they hear the whole story of faith*. Too often we hesitate to tell children the desertion and crucifixion stories, for we wish to protect them from the harsh realities of what really happened. But, until our children hear these stories, they cannot really understand the true joy of Easter.

Second, *hearing the story of the Crucifixion on the "anniversary" of the night it hap- pened* is like hearing the story of Jesus' birth on Christmas Eve or the story of their own birth on their birthday. As children imagine themselves standing near the cross on this powerful night, the stories have greater power.

Third, children *hear the whole story in the sanctuary with the whole congregation*. As they sense the strong feelings around the stories and learn how important they are to all the people gathered there, children have a sense of belonging that helps them to claim the stories as their own.

Fourth, when *their whole family goes to the trouble of worshipping together during Holy Week*, they are acting out their commitment to the Gospel in a very real way that children notice. What better way to show children that Easter is more than a bunny and some eggs? Easter is, after all, about a Lamb.
