I am excited to write my article this week because I have an exciting announcement for our church! This summer we will be welcoming a seminary student from Duke Divinity School as our church's intern! His name is Bailey Hardy and he has just finished his second year of seminary. He is interested in chaplaincy work, but he is not sure yet what context he wants to work in. I've spoken to him briefly over the phone and via email and he has told me that he is excited to get to work with us this summer. And I would say, again, that I am excited for our church to have this opportunity to work with a young seminarian and help him continue to explore the call God has placed on his life.

Bailey's first Sunday with us will be on May 29th and as I think about him coming to our church, I am reminded of something one of my mentors told me once. When I first started out in ministry, I was a summer intern. I worked with a small Baptist church in Milledgeville, Georgia the summer after I graduated from UNC. And I remember the reason that I chose to go and work with that church was because of something their pastor, Alan Mitchell, said. He told me, "One thing I want to be sure you know if you choose to come down here, is that this church understands that our job is not to drain life and talents and gifts out of you. Our job is to pour into you, to help you grow in your faith, to help you explore your call." Honestly, they were faithful to what Alan said. They poured into me that summer and the next one as well. They helped me explore my call and helped me begin to understand that my call was changing from youth ministry to senior ministry. All because they took the time to pray for me, to chat with me, to open up to me, to listen to me—to pour into me.

I hope that over the course of this summer, you will take time to pray for Bailey. Pray that his time here at Hope Valley would be fulfilling. Pray that his faith and his understanding of ministry would be expanded in good ways. Pray that he would remain open to the movement of the Spirit in his life.

It is a way for our church to work for the greater good of God's kingdom, by investing in a future church leader. I'm looking forward to this summer!

Volunteers can sign up to do tasks such as painting the hallways, mulching and landscaping, staining the fence and porch, or organizing donations. They are also looking for volunteers who have a medical background to be at our first aid station and help check vaccination cards. Other opportunities include helping with kids activities, serving food, and being by the street barricades. There are two time slots you can volunteer for:

- Saturday, May 21 morning, 9:00 am 12:00 pm
- Saturday, May 21 afternoon, 12:00 pm 3:00 pm

Volunteers must be 18 years or older, but everyone is welcome to attend. There will be food, live music, activities for kids, and celebration of service!

In order to keep the families, staff, and fellow volunteers safe, volunteers are required to bring proof of vaccination or a negative COVID test result within 72 hours. All volunteers who are working inside will be required to wear a mask, and there will be air purifiers in the hallways. There will be plenty of hand sanitizing stations as well.

FMF is also looking for volunteers to be Team Leads for each project zone. Team Leads will be overseeing and working with a group of 4-10 volunteers on a specific project, (ex. painting the 2nd floor hallway). They will attend a training & orientation session either the week before Rock the Block or earlier on the day of the event.
