We'll be meeting over in the Fellowship Hall at 3:00 to have a discussion about our vision as a church and how we want to accomplish that vision together, with a special focus on how we want to fill the opening we have on staff now that Amy has stepped down as the Minister to Children and their Families.

The idea for this kind of a meeting originally came from the Personnel Team's discussions about how we wanted to go about searching for someone to fill Amy's position. I was working with the team on this and we started asking ourselves some questions. What are the needs the church has? What are the hopes for our church's future? What is the mission God is calling our church to? What kind of minister would help us live into that calling?

As the Personnel Team and I pondered those questions, we began to take the first steps to organize this first Town Hall Meeting. And it was in talking with other church leaders that the idea of discussing the church's vision came up. Where do we see Hope Valley going? How do we want to get there? What kinds of programs would we hope to see in the future? Who would be the best kind of leader to come on staff and help us carry out that vision?

These are some of the questions we're going to ponder together as a church family. I think this discussion on Sunday will be really productive. It will give us an opportunity to dream together and imagine what our future looks like here at Hope Valley. I hope you'll make plans to be here. Come with your ideas. Come with your hopes. Come with an open heart and mind. If you cannot make it this Sunday, please pray for these discussions. Pray for discernment as we seek God's will for our church.

HOPE HOUSE

You can help the Hope House team prepare to welcome refugee families to Durham.

The team is recruiting volunteers to assist with cleaning up the house when the current residents move to permanent housing and getting it ready for the next family. This transition occurs with little warning and must happen quickly. Volunteers are needed for the cleanup crew, to inventory and restock supplies and equipment in the house, to pick up and deliver a welcome meal for the new family, and to support the ministry in other ways. Volunteer opportunities can take anywhere from a few minutes to several hours. New residents generally arrive every few weeks, but the time frame may be longer or shorter depending on circumstances.

To be added to the volunteer list, contact Mike Dossett or Robin at the HVBC Office. Provide your name, phone and email address. You will be contacted when help is needed. If you are available, you'll be assigned to a work crew. Don't worry if you are busy. There will be a new opportunity every few weeks.

Hope House, a collaboration of Hope Valley Baptist Church, other local churches and World Relief of Durham, provides a temporary home for refugees being resettled in Durham.



2022 Deacon Nomination and Election Process

Once you have selected a student (or students), you will receive an email containing information related to your student including his/ her birthdate, address (and email address if applicable), and phone number. You are also encouraged to occasionally mail or drop-off special surprises as appropriate (stickers, balloons/simple crafts for younger students).

Please note—if you are interested in partnering with a college age student, we are coordinating this aspect of the Prayer Partner ministry a little differently this year. We are looking for 3-5 people to work together to care for our college students as a team coordinated by Rhonda Welfare. NOMINATING TEAM

The Nominating Team has included a copy of the 2022-2023 Nominating Report that will be voted on this Sunday (8/28) with this Illuminator. Please review the report and let Jennifer Bowen (jennifer.pt.bowen@gmail.com) know of any changes or tell a team member on Sunday. We are so very grateful for all the ways people have served our church and community in the past year and continue to do so.

We would ask that you consider trying a new ministry this year. As you will see, there are several areas where more help would be appreciated. The areas of greatest need are:

Carolina Reserve - This involves assisting Jacqueline Allen during the Sunday School hour with the class she teaches at Carolina Reserve. This may involve helping residents to/from their rooms, distributing materials, playing piano, or leading with singing.

Greeters - This involves coming to the vestibule about 10:35 am, distributing bulletins in the vestibule or back hallway to the congregation, greeting and assisting visitors, and (for the moment) keeping track of COVID contact tracing.

Family Ministries - This involves helping to organize and run activities for our church family and community such as the Easter Egg Hunt and Trunk or Treat.

Youth Team - This involves planning activities for youth, chaperoning events, and supporting the youth teachers/ministers.

Nominating Team - This involves helping people find ways to use their gifts in the ministries and activities of Hope Valley Baptist Church.

Sound/Audio-Visual Team - This involves working with the musicians and speakers to achieve good audio quality for the in-person congregation as well as the audio and video recordings of the services. It also involves copying the audio recordings and uploading the videos to YouTube for live streaming and recorded presentation.

Areas which are **always** open to more help are:

Decor - Christmas - This group plans, sets up, and takes down the decorations throughout the church for the Christmas season.

Hospitality - This group organizes the set-up, service, and clean-up for events such as Homecoming, Christmas receptions, and the like.

Kitchen - This team takes care of the physical maintenance of the kitchen, cleaning, organizing supplies, and updates as needed.

Missions - This team seeks needs in the community, organizes church events/activities to help meet them such as packing Summer Snacks for McDougal Terrace, and gives all of our congregation the opportunity to be the hands and feet of Christ.

Properties - This team looks after the physical condition of the church. You don't have to be able to rewire a light, but it doesn't hurt! Also needed, though, is help with getting bids for projects, meeting contractors, etc...

Again, thank you all for the many ways you use your gifts to serve!
