In fact, all of the things I've mentioned in this article are instances where we, as a church, came together to tell people that they were seen. We came together to embody our faith, to live it out, because we understand that Christianity is not just an intellectual position to be held—it is a life that we live. And that is all based on the fact that we worship a risen Savior. That takes me to the poem I wanted to share with you all entitled, "Seven Stanzas at Easter," and written by John Updike:

Make no mistake: if He rose at all it was as His body; if the cells' dissolution did not reverse, the molecules reknit, the amino acids rekindle,

the Church will fall.

It was not as the flowers,

each soft Spring recurrent;

it was not as His Spirit in the mouths and fuddled eyes of the eleven apostles; It was as His flesh: ours.

The same hinged thumbs and toes, the same valved heart that—pierced—died, withered, paused, and then regathered out of enduring Might new strength to enclose.

Let us not mock God with metaphor, analogy, sidestepping, transcendence; making of the event a parable, a sign painted in the faded credulity of earlier ages:

let us walk through the door.

The stone is rolled back, not papier-mâché, not a stone in a story,

but the vast rock of materiality that in the slow grinding of time will eclipse for each of us the wide light of day.

And if we will have an angel at the tomb, make it a real angel, weighty with Max Planck's quanta, vivid with hair, opaque in the dawn light, robed in real linen

spun on a definite loom.

Let us not seek to make it less monstrous, for our own convenience, our own sense of beauty, lest, awakened in one unthinkable hour, we are embarrassed by the miracle, and crushed by remonstrance.

Families Moving Forward (FMF) is Durham's largest emergency shelter for families experiencing homelessness in Durham. We are proud of our programming services to break the generational cycle of poverty that leads to homelessness. We have a Family Empowerment Team (FET) that provides families with behavioral health, financial planning, workforce development, and case management services. We have a strong focus on children, with early intervention assessments to identify any developmental or socioemotional delays, and programs and services catered to these needs. We offer aftercare and case management for 18 months after families move into permanent housing so they can maintain safe, stable homes.

Thank you for giving back to the community and to families in need. Because of you, there will be fewer families and children living on the street. Together with volunteers, community partners, and donors like you, we can positively impact families' lives.
