Super Saturday Adventures

Brothers and sisters,

A couple Saturdays ago, our church held our first Super Saturday Adventure of the summer. Basically, we provided two hours of food, fun, fellowship, and education to our local children here in Durham. We told them the story of Jesus feeding thousands of people using just a couple fish and a few loaves. We reminded them that it all started with a little boy's gift. We played games with them and watched them encourage each other. We made crafts that brought the story home and then we worked with them on a mission project to connect what we learned to what we ought to do. Then, we fed them hot dogs and baked beans and ice cream sandwiches! It truly was a wonderful day!

The thing is, we've got another Super Saturday Adventure coming up that you are all welcome to get involved with! It will be on Saturday, July 15th from 10:00 a.m. till 12:00 p.m. This month, we'll be taking a look at the story of Mary and Martha and talking about the ways in which they each express their faith in Jesus. We'll need plenty of volunteers to help us this month as we're hoping to be able to paint with the children and make something really special with them!

So, there are several ways you can get involved. Online registration is already live for the July Adventure. If you go to the HVBC website (hvbc.org) and look at the top menu bar, you'll see a tab that says *Super Saturday Adventures*. When you click on that, you'll be taken to a page with a button that says, "Enroll Now." Click on that, scroll down a little bit, and you'll see two buttons: one to register a child and one to register as a volunteer. Be sure to click on whichever one you need and fill out those forms! That will let us know who all to expect the day of. In addition, there will be a physical sign-up sheet in the vestibule this coming Sunday, though that will just be for volunteers—you'll still need to register children online or on the day at our Registration table. Also, if you registered as a volunteer for the June Adventure, you'll need to register again for July.

HVBC Reads *The Violin Conspiracy* by Brendan Slocomb in July. This mystery novel takes place in the world of classical music. Slocomb is a classically trained violinist who grew up in Fayetteville and graduated from UNC-Greensboro. Before publication of this novel, his first, Slocomb taught public school music. The book has received numerous accolades for the mystery and for its accurate portrayal of the classical music world and the racism encountered by the main character.

There is a possibility we'll have to flip this with *Death on the Nile*, the book scheduled for August, if the Book Club Kit for *The Violin Conspiracy* doesn't show up in the next few days. You need to find your own copy of *Death on the Nile*. The Durham Public Library has several copies, including print book, eBook and audiobook versions, and the book is also available for free as part of a KindleUnlimited subscription.

WOMEN'S FELLOWSHIP LAUNCHES

The group has been renamed Women's Fellowship to align with its expanded mission. The next meeting will be held on **Tuesday**, **July 11 at 10:30 am** and all women are invited -- widowed, divorced, married, single, part of Hope Valley, members of other churches, or not currently part of a church.

The Women's Fellowship will meet every other month. Each meeting of the group will include a brief devotion and lunch, alternating between lunch in the Family Life Center and going out to a restaurant together.
